Sanish is an active collaborator among the Ontario University finance community and was awarded the COFO Distinguished Service Award by the Council of Ontario Universities in 2021. He holds a Bachelor of Arts and a Master of Accounting from the University of Waterloo, and is a Chartered Professional Accountant (CPA, CA).

He is a strategic business partner and outstanding leader, with a proven track record of modernizing and improving financial services in a University environment.
